

Frequently Asked Questions

When is St Marys Indoor Shooting Centre open?

St Marys Indoor Shooting Centre is open seven days a week (except Public Holidays).

We are open: Monday – Saturday 10am – 10pm

Sunday 10am – 6pm

How much does it cost?

SSAA member (must present proof of membership)	\$24.00
Non SSAA member	\$34.00
Cleaning fee for SSAA members to use .22 bolt action rifles	\$7.50
Cleaning fee for SSAA St Marys Pistol Club members who use Club Pistols	\$7.50

What calibres can I shoot?

St Marys Indoor Shooting Centre is approved for Rim-fire and Centrefire calibres up to 12mm (.470). No shotgun, shot shell ammunition or tracers are allowed. Full metal jacketed projectiles are acceptable.

I don't have a firearms licence. Can I still have a go?

St Marys Indoor Shooting Centre holds regular Try Shooting sessions where newcomers are able to try shooting under the careful guidance of Range Safety Officers. For more information about upcoming Try Shooting sessions please call the Range on 02 8889 0406.

I have a firearms licence in another Australian State. Will I be able to shoot?

Yes. Interstate firearms licences are accepted at St Marys however it is a requirement you have your own firearms to use.

I'm an international visitor. What are the rules for me shooting at St Marys?

International visitors should contact the NSW Firearms Registry on 1300 362 562 to enquire about obtaining a permit. If you are unable to obtain a permit you will only be allowed to take part at a designated, Try Shooting session.

I've moved house and need somewhere to store my firearms while my new safe is installed. Can you help?

Yes. St Marys Indoor Shooting Centre has a number of Safe Storage lockers approved by the NSW Firearms Registry that can be rented by club members. For more information, stop by the Range, or give us a call on 02 8889 0406.

Do you have group bookings?

Yes. For bookings of eight or more people please refer to the Try Shooting page on this website or contact 02 8889 0410 for more details. At this point we can only accept groups with a maximum of 24 people.

How do I get my licence?

For long arm licences (A&B) please refer to the drop down menu above and select "Licenses." For pistol licences (H) please refer to the drop down menu above, select "Pistol Club" and scroll down to "Obtaining a pistol license" for a membership pack.

Do you have firearms I can use?

For licenced members .22 bolt action rifles are available to use, a small cleaning fee is charged for their use. For SSAA St Marys Pistol Club members only, a wide range of pistols are also available for a small cleaning fee.

I am a pistol shooter from another club, what do I need to bring?

You are required to show proof of current pistol club membership and your firearms licence.

I need to purchase pistol ammunition, what do I need to provide?

In NSW you must show your registration papers, drivers licence and firearms licence for the pistol ammunition that you want to buy.

What if I can't find my licence?

You will not be allowed to participate in any shooting activities on the range. If you have lost your firearms licence you are required to contact the Firearms Registry to replace it.

What if I turn up without enclosed footwear?

For a small fee the staff at the range counter will sell you a pair of socks when you pay for your range attendance. Range shoes are available for those members who do not have enclosed footwear.

Can I pay my SSAA membership at the Centre?

Yes. St Marys Indoor Shooting Centre can accept membership payments on behalf of SSAA and pass them on. If a member needs their membership to be processed urgently or faster than over the counter, renewing your membership online via the SSAA website is the fastest and most efficient means possible.
